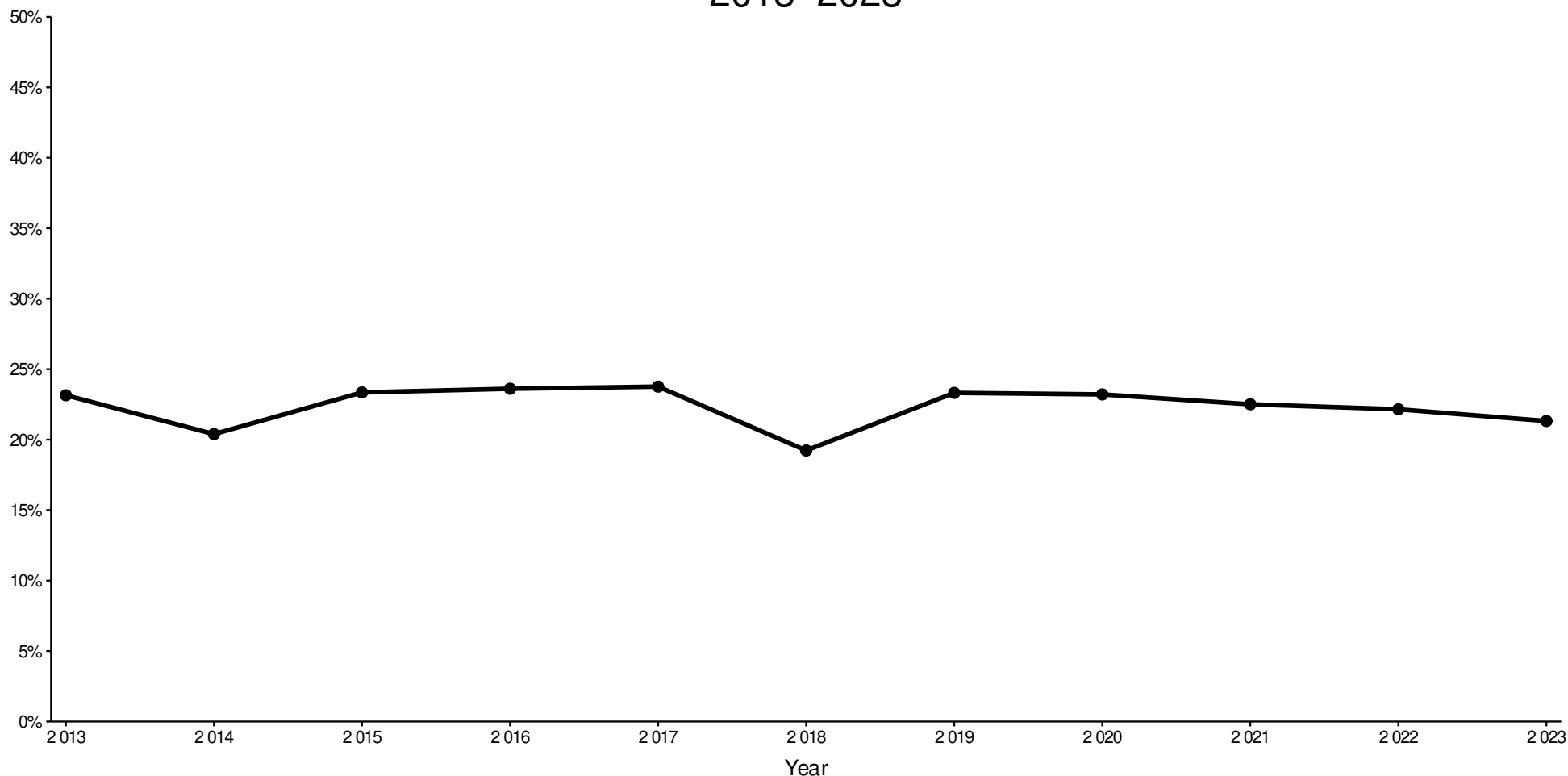


Share of Youth Aged 12 to 17 in New Mexico Diagnosed with Depression (MH-CLD) 2013–2023

Note: This chart shows the proportion of individuals who were diagnosed with a depressive disorder in the SAMHSA MH-CLD, which provides annual information on the mental health characteristics for individuals who have accessed mental health services in facilities or through programs funded or operated by the state mental health facility. Data have been restricted to the 12–14 and 15–17 age groups and to the state of New Mexico. I note that the DSM was revised in both 2013 and 2022. These revisions included changes to diagnosis criteria as well as language revisions.
