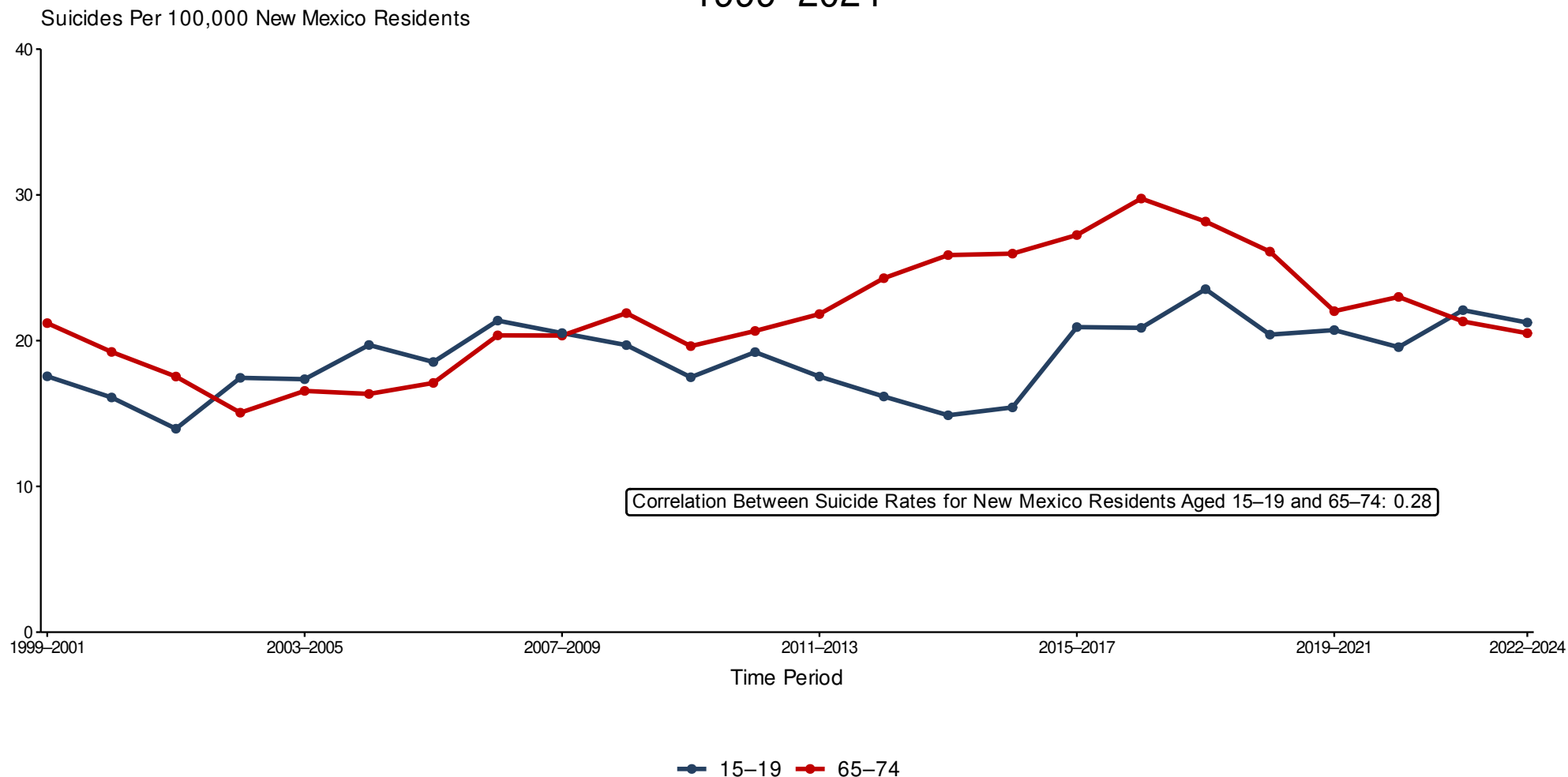


Three-Year Moving Average Suicide Rate per 100,000 New Mexico Residents Aged 15–19 and 65–74 (CDC WONDER)

Note: This chart shows the three-year moving average suicide rate per 100,000 New Mexico residents aged 15-19 and 65-74 as reported by the CDC WONDER Database. CDC WONDER national mortality and population datasets are compiled by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS). These data are derived from the National Vital Statistics System, which aggregates information initially recorded by state registries. For this specific dataset, the figure is based on death certificates for residents in the State of New Mexico, each of which documents a single underlying case of death alongside relevant demographic variables. Data presented in this figure represent the number of mortalities with "Intentional Self-Harm (Suicide)" recorded as the cause of death on the death certificate. I'll also note that data is taken from both the Bridged-Race Results (which includes data from 1999–2020) and Single-Race Results (which includes data for 2018–2024).
